#### Message From Pastor Julie Living Thankful Lives

She was young, betrothed. They were waiting for the customary time to get married, but they were committed to one another. Then the unthinkable happened. She became pregnant, and he knew he wasn't the father. She would be shunned, he would be embarrassed. Both said they had been visited by angels, but really? Come on. He was a



good guy, upstanding. So he didn't leave, both lived with the teasing, the ridicule. It was not easy.

Then, as if things can't get worse the government required them to be counted, and of course, her husband wasn't from the land they lived in. There were no extensions, no extenuating circumstances. The government isn't giving or forgiving. So vastly pregnant, they travel to a small little town. At least they had a donkey, most were walking. No one made arrangements for a place to stay along the way or even when they got there. People saw what she was going through and still nothing, no help, no one cared.

Until one guy said you can stay in the barn, at least you will be out of the elements. What a great place to birth this baby, but what else could happen? Nothing was going right, so what did they expect. Animals, the smell, dirty hay. And when all she wanted to do was rest, a bunch of shepherds showed up-nothing can top that smell. And after a while, they got word again from the government about threats to their child and they had to flee, leave the land they knew. They went to a land where they didn't know if they would be welcome. They longed to live in their own homeland, but it wasn't safe for them, or this child.

Do you recognize the story? Imagine the Christmas story told in this way. May be truth in everything, but it wasn't the overarching point of the story. My favorite line is and Mary pondered all these things in her heart. And in spite of everything going on, I believe she was thankful that God had chosen her.

How we share the stories of our lives are important. We don't need to sugarcoat but are we finding ways to be thankful in all things? Do we gripe about doing laundry, or give thanks that we have clothes to wash? Complain about food we don't like or give thanks we have food? We don't like the paint colors in our room, but we have a room? We don't like a song sung in worship, but we are free to worship? It was a great event, but we tell everyone how it was not.

Living thankful lives reminds us that God is with us. Despite the chaos of living, God is there, God is here. We want to tell the true story so that people will ponder things in their hearts. We so often look at life half full or half empty. But it isn't even about that, for in you our cup runneth over.

As we enter the hectic-ness of the season, I encourage you to intentionally be thankful in the midst of running from family to family, trying to fit in all the things people expect, and experience the joy of Christmas. Joy is selfless, not dependent on the situations around us, it is inward contentment and peace. Jesus is our joy. How will you tell your stories?


The Adult Sunday School will take a break and resume January 5th.

#### North/West Lower Michigan Synod Assembly 18th-20th "Living a Life Worthy of Our Calling"




In 2025, our synod will be calling or renewing the call of a bishop. This is a time when as a

### The Holy Land Christians are Going to be Our Guests

#### HEAR THEIR STORY AND SEE THEIR BEAUTIFUL OLIVEWOOD CRAFTS

On **Dec 8**, 2024 and during both services, we will be hearing about the Christians of the Holy Land, and after each service we will be hosting at the church gathering area display of handmade olive wood religious articles from Bethlehem available for purchase. These carvings include olivewood Nativity sets, crosses, Christmas ornaments, candle holders, angels and many other religious crafts that could make a nice wedding, baptism, confirmation, Easter and Christmas gifts. The carvings are handmade by Christian families from Bethlehem who rely on it for their daily bread.

More than 70% of the Christian Community in the Holy Land depend upon tourism as their only source of income. For decades those Christians have been enduring many hardships as tourism in Bethlehem has plummeted and access to other sources of income has been sharply restricted due to the ongoing conflict, the wars, the 12-yard wall built around Bethlehem, the COVID-19 pandemic, and nowadays the catastrophic ongoing war, due to this, tourists are afraid and unable to visit the Holy Land. This made it very difficult for the Christian families to find their daily bread and forced them to immigrate and flee their homeland since they lost their source of income. The Christian population of the Holy Land was 30% in the last century, today it is less than 1%. If it continues like this, in few years we will find no Christians in the land of Christ, which could cause tragic consequences to our faith and holy sites.

We invite your help in supporting our Christian brothers and sisters in the town of Bethlehem where Christ was born by purchasing their carvings.

A Christian family from Bethlehem will be telling us the story of the Christians of the Holy Land and they will be presenting these carvings after the services.

All proceeds go to support Christian families from Bethlehem.

Let us welcome the Holy Land Christian Solidarity Cooperative in worship and in our hearts.


