It is Time to think about Summer Camp—July 6-11, 2025

Located on the shores of Stony Lake in New Era, Michigan, Living Water Ministries is a safe place for all of God's children to experience intentional community centered in Christ where they are formed in their faith, developed as leaders, and equipped as servants of the gospel. This approach to our work has world-changing implications as participants experience the love of Christ in each member of the community and return home to share that same love with others.

We offer a variety of summer programs for students completing grades 1 through 12 and specialty programs including weeks for children in foster care, adults with developmental disabilities, and high school students aspiring to be anti-racist leaders.

Our vision is clear: To create communities centered in Christ to transform lives and the world. Our mission is real: Bringing together all of God's children to experience Christian community, grow in faith, develop leadership skills, and serve others. Ascension youth will attend the week of Sunday, July 6th through Friday, July 11th. We encourage every youth to attend at least once, though many attend year after year, and advance through the opportunities as they age.

Camps offered the Week of July 6-11, 2025

- Entering Grades 1-3—Explorers: An abbreviated camp experience for younger campers wanting to give camp a test drive. This program begins Sunday and ends Wednesday.
- Entering grades 3-6—Discoverers: A classic camp experience designed for your child to discover the love and grace of Christian community as they also begin to discover who they are as children of God. **If your child is entering 6th grade and planning to start confirmation this coming year, please register for Challengers.
- Middle School (grades 6-8)—Challengers: Challenge is at the core of this experience as campers grow in understanding their own gifts & abilities through classic camp activities and our low and high ropes challenge courses. **If your child is entering 6th grade and planning to start confirmation this coming year, please register for Challengers.
- **High School (grades 9-12)—Adventurers:** Make a difference in the name of Christ by serving others, while enjoying camp classics!

July 13-18, 2025: Bridge Builders (completed 9th grade through 12^{th)} Grow as a leader, develop peer ministry skills, and join the fight against racism as an expression of your faith & our call to love our neighbors! This week of camp is dedicated to our Bridge Builders program in which participants will be a part of experiences unique to this program. This week also includes typical camp activities such as low ropes, high ropes, swimming and skill shops.

It is our hope that raising young leaders in the faith formative community of camp can be a place where real change in the world and church can begin. By exploring systemic racism, we hope to inspire campers to be change agents as they grow into adults of faith and leaders in the church and world. Our intent is to equip participants to see the world with new eyes of faith and to be able to evaluate where they currently or someday might serve as gatekeepers and people-in-charge. Time will be spent equipping campers on how to host or engage courageous conversations for the sake of the Gospel.

Participants are trained by blending peer ministry curriculum with anti-racism curriculum to create leaders equipped to listen, facilitate, and engage others about challenging & meaningful topics. Our Bridge Builders planning team is made up of camp professionals, pastors, educators, social workers, and youth ministry professionals.

We are beginning our 2025 bible study on **Monday, February 3, 2025 at 1:00 p.m.** at the Digging Dunes room at Ascension.





Make a catch of fish to show what happens when Jesus calls his first disciples.

What you need:

- Cardboard egg carton
- Acrylic paint
- Paintbrush
- Darning needle
- Fishing twine
- Scissors
- Googly eyes or buttons
- Glue



What you do:

- 1. From the egg carton, cut out the 12 cups. From the lid, cut out two fish tails.
- 2. On a protected surface, turn the cups upside down. Paint the outside of each cup and both sides of the tails. Let dry.
- 3. Thread the needle with an arm's length of twine. Tie a knot at the end.
- 4. Thread the needle through the end of the tail. Tie another knot an inch from the tail.
- 5. Thread the needle through one upside-down cup. Pull the twine through until the cup rests on the knot.
- 6. Continue tying knots an inch above each cup and threading on another cup until you've strung six cups. Tie a knot above the last cup and leave a long string to hang the fish. (You can make two fish with each egg carton.)
- 7. Add googly eyes or buttons to the last cup to make a face.
